SOS proudly serves everyone who has experienced sexual or domestic violence, stalking, human trafficking, child abuse or neglect. SOS can help.

Our unwavering mission is to empower and advocate for those affected by sexual and domestic violence, child abuse and neglect. SOS believes all forms of abuse are unacceptable and that every person – adult and child alike – deserves to feel safe wherever they may be.

Our Vision:

We envision a community in which every person lives without fear of interpersonal violence.

Who We Are

Through education and personal advocacy, SOS provides services and support to protect victims. SOS partners with local service providers and community resources to ensure our clients receive the highest level of advocacy possible while protecting a client's right to confidentiality.

We focus on safety and support, both on the home front and in a courtroom setting, for those who have experienced sexual or domestic violence, child abuse or neglect. SOS helps explore options through which families in crisis can build healthy futures.

Each SOS program evaluates needs on a case-by-case basis to best serve our clients and the community. We regularly collaborate with community partners to educate and prevent interpersonal violence.

Crisis and Outreach Services

Professionally trained advocates provide assistance for victims of sexual and domestic violence, stalking, and human trafficking. Advocates meet with these individuals, listen to fully understand the nature of their abuse, help to identify specific risk factors and discuss a variety of safety measures they can choose to pursue. CASA of the Flint Hills

Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) provides highly-trained volunteer advocates in Lyon and Chase Counties to advocate for the best interests of abused and neglected children involved in the court system. CASA volunteers uncover facts and make recommendations to the court in the child's best interest. CASA volunteers must be twenty-one years of age or older. Child Visitation & Exchange Center (CVEC)

The CVEC offers supervised visitation or monitored exchanges in a safe, neutral environment for children and their families. With a friendly, nurturing atmosphere, the CVEC focuses on the safety and well-being of every child. The CVEC is open seven days a week. Referrals from court, community agencies and individuals are accepted. For more information please call 620-342-0076.

Child Advocacy Center (CAC)

The CAC receives case referrals from law enforcement or the Kansas Department for Children and Families (DCF) regarding cases of alleged child abuse or neglect to facilitate a child disclosure interview for prosecution purposes. The CAC then facilitates an informed multidisciplinary community partner team that comes together and monitors case progression for a child victim-centered resolution. The CAC offers advocacy support from case referral to case resolution.
